Before Christmas break, Nelson County FFA members participated in Holiday Extravaganza. After singing carols at a local nursing home, FFA members went shopping with money raised by members and purchased items for angel tree students from NCHS and for the Barktown Rescue. NCHS FFA members helped to brighten Christmas for NCHS students and animals in the community.

Hannah Richardson, a freshmen agriculture student and FFA member at NCHS, was awarded a \$250 grant from the Kentucky Livestock Grant Program. This is a state award and the money will be utilized by Hannah to purchase a market boer goat to grow her Supervised Agricultural Experience program. Hannah will use the goat for show purposes and will sell the goat to market at the conclusion of the show season.

Jacob Ball and Mike Glass, Agriculture teachers at NCHS, were both awarded \$1500 grants to help fund the travel and registration costs to attend CASE Training. CASE stands for Curriculum for Agricultural Science Education. After attending the CASE training at over next summer, the

agriculture curriculum at NCHS will be modified with more math and science integration. This merit based grant will ease the cost of attending this training and benefit student enrolled in agriculture in the years to come.
